



COLLECTIVE BARGAINING

The United Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers of America ("UE") are trying to get team members to sign union authorization cards. Before signing a card, make sure you get all the facts because:

Bringing in the UE could bring changes that don't work for you!

No one – including the UE – can predict what will happen in bargaining. Under the labor law:

- The parties must bargain in "good faith." This means the parties must meet with each other, make proposals, and respond to proposals.
- > The law *does not* compel either party to agree to the other's proposals.

Here is what we *don't know*.

- What your wage rates will be after negotiations?
- > What scheduling will look like after negotiations?
- What "seniority" will look like after negotiations?
- > What the holiday schedule will look like?
- What your work hours and breaks will look like?

Your terms and conditions of employment could be *better, worse, or stay the same*. The only thing we know for certain is that the UE will try to collect *union dues*.

Compare this with the ability we have right now to work together and solve problems.

Don't give up a good thing for the unknown!
